

This week we hope to have Fr. Patrick back to talk about his mission in Sudan – the poorest country in the world. Maybe Yemen is beating them out for that title these days, but you get the point. Fr. Patrick will be talking about the work he does using pictures and explanations. His parish collection is about \$5 a month. There are no churches in the 13 places he visits as his parish. Their Mass is outside or in something like we would have as a pavilion. So, his parishes depend on his community, the Missionaries of St. Paul (MSP), for their sustenance. Any money we can give genuinely helps them. He told me that his big projects are clean water, a school, and his parishioners' mental and physical health. The mortality rate is terrible, but he had no figures because they were unavailable, and that's only the tip of the iceberg. But we will get into detail about all of that. So, join us for FYF, Follow Your Faith, this Sunday at 7 pm.

INTERESTED IN BECOMING A HOST FAMILY?


Bishop McCort Catholic High School is looking for families willing to host International Students from Europe. Be a part of this exciting program by giving a student the American experience.

DIOCESE OF ALTOONA-JOHNSTOWN WOMEN'S CONFERENCE September 16 @ Mount Aloysius

Spiritual nourishment, uplifting messages, fellowship, and fun are in store at the Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown STRENGTH IN CHRIST Women's Conference on Sept. 16 at Mount Aloysius College in Cresson. Internationally recognized speakers Kitty Cleveland and Mary Castner will be the keynote presenters. Cleveland, a singer/songwriter, began her professional career as a lawyer, a college professor, and then during a visit to the adoration chapel in 1998 during a family crisis, she heard Jesus call her to music missionary. Castner's life changed when she discovered praise and worship music at age 14 and earned degrees in Theology & Catechetics from the Franciscan University of Steubenville. Castner serves as a youth minister at Shove the Dove Catholic podcast. The conference will include Mass with Bishop Mark, Confession, and lunch. The conference runs from 9 am — 4 pm with check-in at 7:30 am. Ladies are invited to stay and pray the rosary from 4—5 pm. The cost is \$20 for adults; \$10 for high school and college students.
