Youth Faith Formation (YFF)

I got to mention our YFF, Youth Faith Formation, this past week in my homily. I wanted to acknowledge our many adult catechists (between 30 to 40) presently involved in that process with our children. Also, I mentioned that whether it's intentional or "just the way things are these days," we live in a completely secular culture that will never speak the truth about God, Faith, or Religion to our children.

Mainly because they don't know it themselves. and, some might say, who cares? Many people get along quite nicely without God or Religion in their lives. Maybe. I know I can't; I tried. And I am aware of and know many who are NOT getting along quite nicely. Aren't we hearing that our younger generation is struggling deeply with many challenging mental and emotional problems? So, while it may seem that "many are getting along quite nice-ly," there's a good chance that's not really true under the surface.

So, you and I have a commitment we made to our children at baptism. "Will you bring your children up in the practice of the faith," in my experience, everyone has said, "Yes!" So, you/ we have a grave obligation to practice the faith in our homes, and it is our privilege and duty as your parish to help you. So, please, I beg all parents, don't allow just about anything to get in the way of the Faith Formation of your children. It's more critical than ever today, given the secular nature of our culture.

And we can't teach what we do not know ourselves. Thus, the Adult Faith Formation classes. If your kids see you doing it, all this will be much more important to them. So, thanks, Mom and Dad, grandparents, adult catechists. Thanks, Hanna LaBar, Jess Smith, Cathy Vigna, Audrey Shaffer, and Ali Koch, for being our leaders. We desperately need you. Thanks, parishioners, for your support. All of us have a role, Including YOU!

Spiritual nourishment, uplifting messages, fellowship, and fun are in store at the Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown STRENGTH IN CHRIST Women's Conference on Sept. 16 at Mount Aloysius College in Cresson. Internationally recognized speakers Kitty Cleveland and Mary Castner will be the keynote presenters. Cleveland, a singer/songwriter, began her professional career as a lawyer, and a college professor. Then during a visit to the adoration chapel in 1998 during a family crisis, she heard Jesus call her to be a music missionary. 
