

FR. MARK'S NOTES

The Passing of Pope Benedict

Since I heard of the passing of Pope Benedict XVI, I have seen a stream of articles with people's reflections on the Pope, his personality, his life as a scholar, his tenure as a Pope, and his historic retirement. We hope to talk about all of that this week on our January 8 **Facebook Live** session of "Follow Your Faith." So, it's been a lot. I'm sure all of you homeowners can relate. Thanks for reading. The staff thought I should tell you all of that. And I'm just giving you the headlines. ADULT FAITH FORMATION

Stay tuned for the "2023 Winter/Spring Adult Faith Formation" offerings. We will offer some of the same classes and offer a few new ones. The new sessions will begin on Sunday, January 8 at 9:45 a.m.

The Chosen: Season 1—(with Sue Lovette & Jerry Clark) Season 1 tells the story of Christ's early ministry while he is still an anonymous Jewish wanderer. The show's story is incomplete, but the first eight episodes cover Christ's meeting with the six first disciples and Mary Magdalene.

PRAYING WITH BODY, MIND, AND VOICE

BOWING: Bowing signifies reverence, respect, and gratitude. In the Creed, we bow at the words that commemorate the Incarnation. We also bow as a sign of reverence before we receive Communion. When entering and leaving the sanctuary, the priest and other ministers bow to the altar, a symbol of Christ. Finally, as a sign of respect and reverence, even in our speech, we bow our heads at the name of Jesus, the mention of the Three Persons of the Trinity, and the saint whose particular feast or memorial is being observed.

GENUFLECTING: As a sign of adoration, we genuflect by bringing our right knee to the floor. Many also make the Sign of the Cross as they bend their knees. Traditionally, Catholics genuflect on entering and exiting the Church if the Blessed Sacrament is present in the sanctuary of the Church. The priest and deacon also genuflect in adoration after he shows the Body and Blood of Christ to the people after the consecration and again before inviting the people to Holy Communion.
