

FR. MARK'S NOTES

ME25

This week we will be making available the results of our 1st "Member Engagement Survey. I encourage you to look at and study the results of the survey. And, just as important, we welcome you to share your thoughts and comments. Now, as you begin to study, please read the introductory pages. They will help you understand the results and what they mean for us moving forward.

I want to point out three important terms to help you understand the ME 25 results. First, there are the "Engaged." These are parishioners who have a strong psychological connection to the parish. They are more spiritually committed. Then, there are the "Not Engaged." These members may attend regularly but ARE NOT psychologically connected to the parish. Their connection is more social than spiritual. (I think this is a very critical distinction.) They are less likely to invite others and more likely to leave. Then there are the "Actively Disengaged." These members usually show up only once or twice a year. They are on the membership rolls and can tell you what parish they belong to — but may not be able to name the priest. These are three terms that will help you grasp the material of the survey.

Here are some broad-stroke thoughts on my part that will inspire you to study the survey results. First, we are above average in almost every category, from "Catholics Overall" to "Faith Overall." That's awesome. However, on the flip side, most who took the time to do the survey were over 55 years old. Where is the under-55 crowd? Why did they, in large numbers, not take the time to do the survey?

One question that jumped off the page was about those who said they were "engaged" but did not feel appreciated. That one struck me. Also, there was another question where people said they didn't feel like they were being informed about what was happening in the parish. How can we do better in informing you? As you know, we offer online information, robocalls, emails, texts, website, and the bulletin as ways we seek to communicate now. Should we offer others?

While this survey didn't ask this question, I am most interested in knowing how many people in the parish are involved in either Faith Formation, Small Groups, Liturgy of the Word, Facebook Live, or Daily Mass. And/or, who may not be involved in any of them but are still using other resources outside the parish to grow in their life of Faith. I'd love to know that stat!!! That would mean a lot!!

All this is a way for us to discern where we are going and if we will be effective in you growing in your life of Faith and your Engagement in the life of the parish. So let us know your thoughts. We could use Facebook Live as another avenue to share our thoughts. Thanks.

ARE YOU OR A FRIEND GRIEVING THE LOSS OF A LOVED ONE?


