FR. MARK'S NOTES

Eucharistic Revival

We have been discussing the Eucharistic Revival this Lent and asking our small groups to read and study the Eucharist during Lent. There are a ton of resources out there to choose from, and I will address the Eucharist when I am able on Sundays.

I am currently reading a good book about the Eucharist titled, "Real Presence: What does it mean and why does it Matter?" by Timothy O'Malley. In one section, a good one, on "misunderstanding about the Eucharist, O'Malley writes, "We confess that Christ is present in the Eucharist not because we perceive this presence with our senses (a kind of certainty), but because the intellect has been transformed by Faith (evangelized and properly catechized) to recognize the presence of love. [The parenthesis are mine.] He goes on, "The precise language of the doctrine is designed to avoid an overly physical account of Christ's presence, AND as a merely symbolic one. The Eucharist is the PERSONAL presence of Jesus Christ." Here's another thoughtful quote to ponder. O'Malley is speaking of the word transubstantiation. "The substance of this bread and this wine are transformed. On the level of substance, there is no more bread. There is no more wine. Rather the Eucharist is the total and real presence of Jesus Christ, given to the Church in what looks like bread and wine. The species or appearance, that is, the "accidents" of bread and wine, remain available to our senses, sustained only by a miracle."

It's crucial given that the Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith. Some suggested Eucharistic Revival Resources:

EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL: DID YOU KNOW?

Our Lord Jesus Christ shared the Passover meal with his disciples the evening before His suffering and death on the cross. During this meal, Jesus instituted the holy sacrament of His Body & Blood. The institution of the Eucharist is captured in all four Gospels:

- Matthew 26:26-30
- Mark 14:22-26
- Luke 22:14-20
- John 6:22-59 (Bread of Life Discourse)

This declaration by Jesus through the Gospels sets the groundwork for the Holy Eucharist we share today.


